There are over 530 walks on the Carmarthen Ramblers website which are freely available to anyone. In fact their use is encouraged so that the routes are walked and kept open for the pleasure and enjoyment of all.

Give them a try, visit <http://www.carmarthenramblers.org.uk> and download a file from their archive and follow the instructions which are quite straight forward, there is even a YouTube tutorial you can follow.

### Instructions.

You may **view** or **print** any of these walks on a free online Ordnance Survey map. Follow the instructions below to do this.

1. **First**, select a file from the list to download to your computer, using your **RIGHT**\_mouse button to click on the file link.
2. **Then**, in the box that appears, click your **LEFT** mouse button on "**Save Link As**" (or "**Save Target As**") and save the file to your own computer, in a folder location and with a file name of your choice.
3. **Next**, you can open the file using one of the online mapping programs listed in [Useful Links](#). One of these is [Where's The Path](#), and you can download the full instructions for using *Where's The Path* below:
